We can't thank her enough for all she does to preserve our "Heritage of Honor" This proclamation was presented to the Daughdrill Family at our memorial service on the 27th.




Headstone Dedication Success!

Dedication Ceremony Held for CSA Pvt. Henry Daughdrill

On Saturday, January 27, 2024, at 1200 PM, the Gainesville Volunteers, Sons of Confederate Veterans, Camp 273, Piczyune, Miss., organized a Confederate headstone dedication at Daughdrill

The ceremony, attended by a substantial crowd, included a proclamation from State Representative Statesy Hobgood-Wilkes of Picayune. Seven Stars Artillery Capt Daryi Ledner led a reenactment cannon salute, followed by the playing of Tapa and guest speakers, including Mrs. Janice Strohm, Chapter President of the Beauvoir Chapter, United Daughters of the Confederacy. The Masser of Ceremonies, Hon. Confederacy. The Masser of Ceremonies, Hon. Charlie Schmitz, Camp Adjutant, facilitated the event. The Gainesville Volunteers ordered a headstone

for Pvi—Daughdrill from the U.S. Department of Veteran Affairs (V.A.), which was dedicated during the ceremony. Additionally, a Southern Cross of Honor was placed at his grave.



Amazon to invest \$10B in two Mississippi data centers

Amazon Web Services is investing \$10 bil-lion in two data centers in Mississippi and lawnakers approved \$560 million in taxpay-er funds on Thursday to help finance the regulari.

State officials say the project will be the

State officials say the project will be the bargest capital investment in the state's history, dwarfing the \$2.5 billion Steel Dynamics project announced last year and a \$2 billion battery plant project approved last week. State officials say 1,000 jebs will be created in the data centers located in two Madison County industrial parks north of Jackson. One of the bills passed in the special session says taxpayers will also provide loses and grants for 'site preparation, utilities, real estate purchases, infrastructure, utilities, reads, ruil improvements, public works, buildings and fixtures, job recruitment and training, as well as planning, dosign, environmental inspact studies."

The bills passed in record time in the one-

The bills passed in record time in the one-day special session with almost unanimous support by lawmakers. House Bill 1 created the Project Atlas fund to provide financial support for the project, while House Bill 2 had specific appropriations and Sensel Bill 2001 was the vehicle for the project's incentiva mechanics.

2001 was the vehicle for the project's meen-tive package.

The project will also receive tax breaks on the state's franchise tax, which is being phased out over the next few years, and the state's T's, sales levy.
