After submitting Pvt. Daughdrill of the Daughdrill Cemeteries VA headstone application. I received a letter on April 24, denying my request for a VA Headstone for Pvt. Daughdrill. The reason cited was since Pvt. Daughdrill served in a reserve unit the 3rd Battalion MS. Cav. Reserve. And their records did not indicate that his unit was federalized into national service which made him eligible for a VA memorial product. WELL after talking to Mr. H Grady Howell who was my last hope. Mr. Howell gave me the information which I will never forget. And that was the 3rd Battn. MS. Cav. Reserves was incorporated into Denis's Brigade in 1864 which was dissolved into Moorsman's Brigade which became the 24th MS Cav. C.S.A. on January 24, 1865. Which means that Pvt. Daughdril has the legal right to a VA memorial product. So an appeal to the National Cemetery Administration was sent in early may giving them more information to prove my application.
